<p><b>M.K.OA.A.3</b></p> <p>Find a cup and 10 small items (rocks, legos, pennies, etc.). Take the cup to hide a few of the small pieces at a time. How many are hiding under the cup? <i>**How many more to make 10?*</i></p> <p>Keep playing for 5-10 minutes.</p>	<p><b>ELA.R.K.3</b></p> <p>Choose a favorite book to read (or have someone read to you). After the story, talk about who are the <u>characters</u>, where does the <u>setting</u> take place, and what were the important <u>events</u> that happened throughout the story.</p>	<p><b>ELA.W.K.1</b></p> <p>Grab a piece of paper, a pencil and coloring tools. Draw a picture about what you have done today. Label parts of your picture. Then, use your label words to write a sentence or two.</p>
<p><b>M.K.CC.A.3</b></p> <p>See if you can find two dice with dots. Roll both dice. What numbers did you roll? Write a number you can make. (Roll a total of 10 times.)</p> <p><b>Example:</b> You rolled a 3 and 1. You could write 31 OR 13.</p>	<p><b>ELA.RF.K.2c</b></p> <p>Write <b>'at'</b> at the top of a piece of paper. Add a letter to the beginning to make a new word. Write it down. Keep trying new beginning sounds. Make a list of all <b>'at'</b> words you can think of. (Try <b>'en'</b> or <b>'ig'</b> words, too.)</p>	<p><b>ELA.L.K.6d</b></p> <p>Practice writing your upper and lowercase letters. Start at the beginning of the alphabet ... Aa, Bb, Cc. Write both upper and lowercase letter pairs together.</p>
<p><b>M.K.CC.A.1</b></p> <p>We have been counting to 50; working towards counting past 100! Practice counting by seeing how long it takes you to pick up your toys, walk around the house, or another activity.</p>	<p><b>ELA.RF.K.3c</b></p> <p>Grab your planner from your backpack. Flip back through and practice reading our <i>sight words</i> listed each week. How many do you know?</p>	<p><b>ELA.RF.K.3c → Heart Words</b></p> <p>Grab your planner from your backpack. Look through your <i>sight words</i>. Choose 5-10 words to write. What part(s) of each word do you need to learn by heart? Draw a heart above those letter sounds.</p>
